Preparation Times

1 Peter 5:6

6 Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in <u>due time</u>,

6 So be content with who you are, and don't put on airs. God's strong hand is on you; He'll promote you at the right time. [MESSAGE]

6 So humble yourselves under the mighty power of God, and at the <u>right time</u> He will lift you up in honor.

Ephesians 2:10

10 For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.

2 Timothy 2:20-22

20 But in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and silver, but also of wood and clay, some for honor and some for dishonor.

21 Therefore if anyone cleanses himself from the latter, he will be a vessel for honor, sanctified and useful for the Master, <u>prepared</u> for every <u>good work</u>.

2 looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Matthew 7:3–5

3 And why do you look at the speck in your brother's eye, but do not consider the plank in your own eye?

4 Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me remove the speck from your eye'; and look, a plank is in your own eye?

5 Hypocrite! <u>First</u> remove the plank from your own eye, and <u>then</u> you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye.

Acts 13:13

13 From Paphos, Paul and company put out to sea, sailing on to Perga in Pamphylia. That's where John called it quits and went back to Jerusalem. [MESSAGE]

Acts 15:36-39

36 Then after some days Paul said to Barnabas, "Let us now go back and visit our brethren in every city where we have preached the word of the Lord, and see how they are doing."

37 Now Barnabas was determined to take with them John called Mark.

38 But Paul insisted that they should not take with them the one who had departed from them in Pamphylia, and had not gone with them to the work.

39 Then the contention became so sharp that they parted from one another. And so Barnabas took Mark and sailed to Cyprus;

2 Timothy 4:11

11 Only Luke is with me. Get Mark and bring him with you, for he is useful to me for ministry.

11 Luke is the only one here with me. Bring Mark with you; he'll be my right-hand man

Acts 13:1–4

1 Now in the church that was at Antioch there were certain prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul.

2 As they ministered to the Lord and fasted, the Holy Spirit said, "Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."

3 Then, having fasted and prayed, and laid hands on them, they sent them away.

4 So, being sent out by the Holy Spirit, they went down to Seleucia, and from there they sailed to Cyprus.

1 Timothy 1:12

12 And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord who has <u>enabled</u> me, because He counted me faithful, putting me into the ministry

12 I give thanks to Him Who has granted me [the needed] strength and made me able [for this], Christ Jesus our Lord, because He has judged and counted me faithful and trustworthy, appointing me to [this stewardship of] the ministry. [AMP]

12 I'm so grateful to Christ Jesus for making me adequate to do this work. [Message]

Proverbs 16:1

1 The preparations of the heart belong to man, But the answer of the tongue is from the LORD.

1 THE PLANS of the mind and orderly thinking belong to man, but from the Lord comes the [wise] answer of the tongue. [AMP]

1 To man belong the plans of the heart, but from the LORD comes the reply of the tongue. NIV

Proverbs 13:12

12 Hope deferred makes the heart sick, But when the desire comes, it is a tree of life.

12 Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a dream fulfilled is a tree of life. [NLT]

Appointed Times

Ephesians 4:15-16

15 but, speaking the truth in love, may grow up in all things into Him who is the head — Christ —

16 from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love.

16 Under his direction, the whole body is fitted together perfectly. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts grow, so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love. [NLT]

Acts 15:22, 30-31

22 Then it pleased the apostles and elders, with the whole church, to send chosen men of their own company to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas, namely, Judas who was also named Barsabas, and Silas, leading men among the brethren.

30 So when they were sent off, they came to Antioch; and when they had gathered the multitude together, they delivered the letter.

31 When they had read it, they rejoiced over its encouragement.

Acts 15:32-34

32 Now Judas and Silas, themselves being prophets also, exhorted and strengthened the brethren with many words.

33 And after they had stayed there for a time, they were sent back with greetings from the brethren to the apostles.

34 However, it seemed good to Silas to remain there.

Acts 15:39-41

39 Then the contention became so sharp that they parted from one another. And so Barnabas took Mark and sailed to Cyprus;

40 but Paul chose Silas and departed, being commended by the brethren to the grace of God.

41 And he went through Syria and Cilicia, strengthening the churches.

Romans 8:14

14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God.

Colossians 3:15

15 And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful.
